Our Christmas Eve Worship Service at Parma-South Presbyterian Church will be at **4 PM on December 24.** The service will be family-oriented. Come join us as we celebrate the birth of our Savior, Jesus Christ with song and voice.





Parma-South will hold a "Blue Christmas" service on Saturday afternoon, December 21 at 3 PM. This contemplative service is held on or around the Winter Solstice, the longest night of the year. For those who mourn and for those who struggle, this service provides a space for those grieving a loss or not feeling especially "joyful" this holiday season.





Dear Parma-South Family,

As we begin the Advent season, a time of anticipation and hope, I invite you to join us on a unique journey through the birth narrative of Jesus. This year, we will be guided by the "From the Manger" program from *Illustrated Ministry*. I think you'll find this to be a fresh and imaginative approach to Advent that centers on the theme of hunger and nourishment.

The story of Jesus, the "Bread of Life," is deeply intertwined with the theme of food. From His birth in a feeding trough in Bethlehem, (literally translates to the "House of Bread" in English) to his miraculous feeding of the multitudes, Jesus continually demonstrates His compassion for those who hunger, both physically and spiritually.

This Advent, we will explore the various ways in which Jesus satisfies our deepest needs. We will delve into the biblical text, reflecting on the symbolism of the manger and the significance of Jesus' birth. We will consider how the story of Jesus' birth speaks to our own experiences of hunger and longing. We will also, of course, encounter the hope, peace, joy, and love that Jesus brings to the world, and we will be challenged to share these gifts with others.

In addition to our regular worship services, we'll have a "Longest Night" (sometimes called "Blue Christmas") Service on Saturday, December 21st at 3 pm. This is a contemplative service on the longest night of the year that provides a space for those grieving a loss of any kind. It's also appropriate for anyone who isn't feeling especially "joyful" this holiday season. Everywhere in the world tells you to be happy and cheerful this time of year, this is one place where you can slow down and be authentic with God.

As we enter into this Advent season, I encourage you to embrace the unconventional, and to approach this season with open hearts and minds. Let us allow the story of Jesus' birth nourish our souls and inspire us to live lives of compassion and service. May this be a time of spiritual renewal and growth for you and your family. May you experience the love and peace of Christ in a profound way. And may you be filled with gratitude for the gift of God's Son, the "Bread of Life."
